The project was created by Senior Assistant Prof. Regina Koycheva, PhD and started in 2024 by a team of two researchers from IL-BAS – R. Koycheva (palaeoslavist) and Senior Assistant Prof. Hristo Todorov, PhD (Greekist). Two more specialists from other institutions were included during 2025 – Senior Assistant Prof. Stanka Petrova, PhD (palaeoslavist from “Paisii Hilendarski” University of Plovdiv) and Regina-Oktavia Ivanova (PhD student in musicology at the Institute of Art Studies at BAS). The team is carrying out research on the sound side of Greek ancient and medieval literary works, Old Bulgarian original artistic and non-artistic texts from various genres (hymnography, inscriptions, etc.), and Slavic translated chants from different eras. The project gives the opportunity to make studies in three possible directions: literary, linguistic or musicological. The expected practical results of the cooperation are scholarly publications and papers read at conferences and workshops.
